FROM THE ASSOCIATE PASTOR ... INVESTING IN YOUR FAMILY FEBRUARY 2025

Just because love can be freely given doesn't mean it doesn't cost.

A mother extends her love to her children in countless ways throughout the day. She never charges them for cooking meals, cleaning rooms, washing clothes, or transporting them to school. But each of these activities costs her time, money, and energy.

A friend expresses love in numerous ways throughout the year - a birthday card, a timely phone call, a warm hug, and a helping hand. There is no price tag attached to any of these. It would be easy to assume that love really is free. But then we would have a difficult time explaining what we mean when we say that friendship requires work.

God paints the world with His affection for us. Sunsets which take our breath away, food in abundance, good health (for most of us), and His power available through prayer. God never submits a bill for His kindnesses. But just because His love is free, doesn't mean that it didn't dearly cost Him.

I like how the Living Bible puts it - "But God showed his great love for us by sending Christ to die for us while we were still sinners." (Romans 5:8) Jesus literally had to die experiencing God's anger so that you and I could live experiencing God's love.

OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD SHOEBOX MINISTRY

In 2024, 11,927,439 shoeboxes were packed around the world. Of those, 10,574,805 were packed here in the United States. If you packed a shoebox, you are a vital part of this ministry. All these shoeboxes are being sent to children around the world. Continue to pray for these shoeboxes and the children who will receive them. And pray for those who hand out the boxes, present the gospel message to the children, and teach the follow up discipleship program, "The Greatest Journey."

SBC received \$4,140 in designated offerings to go towards the shoebox ministry and a check for that amount was sent to Samaritan's Purse for Operation Christmas Child. It is amazing what God can do with a simple shoebox!

Make this heartfelt craft as a decoration or gift.

What you need:

- Yarn
- Scissors
- Parchment paper
- Baking sheet
- Heart-shaped cookie cutters
- ¼ cup cornstarch
- ½ cup water
- Adult help



What you do:

- 1. Cut yarn into 12-inch pieces.
- 2. Place cookie cutters atop a baking sheet lined with parchment paper.
- Combine cornstarch and water in a saucepan. Heat mixture over medium heat, stirring until thick and smooth. Remove from heat and cool to form a "glue."
- 4. Dip each piece of yarn into the mixture to coat completely. Squeeze off any excess.
- Place yarn in the cookie cutters, allowing pieces to cross and loop within the heart. Add more until the cookie cutter is filled and the yarn looks like a heart.
- 6. Remove cookie cutters and bake the sheet for two hours at 150°F, or until hearts are dry and hard.
